FUNCHAL, PORTUGAL

A beautiful city with an alluring mix of classic Portuguese architecture and natural beauty, explore the coast of a sunny bay where fennel (funcho) once grew in abundance. Madeira's first city is a charming and exciting visit. On arrival in Funchal, we are met by our local guide and transferred by private coach to our hotel where we settle in and relax. This evening, join us for a casual welcome dinner. (D)

NUN'S VALLEY

Today we travel by coach to see breathtaking views of the surrounding mountains of Nun's Valley by way of the Eira do Serrado viewpoint. We visit Curral das Freiras, a small village nestled among the highest mountains and sample Ginja, Portuguese liquor infused with sour cherries and chestnut cake. We continue to Pico dos Barcelos for a panoramic view over Funchal bay and the amphitheatre. Following lunch in a local restaurant we visit the traditional fishing village of Câmara de Lobos, which was also a favourite of Winston Churchill. We stop for spectacular views at Cabo Girão before returning to Funchal. This evening dinner is at our hotel. (B,L,D)





MADEIRA & WINE FESTIVAL

Our day begins with a visit to the 2nd-largest peak on the island, Pico Arieiro, before visiting Ribeiro Frio to visit the beautiful gardens and the famous trout pond. This is also the starting point for many levada walks, a series of relaxing hiking trails. We visit Santana to see the triangular houses built of stone with their thatched roofs.

Lunch is at a very special location that celebrates the wine season. We are greeted with a welcome drink, Madeira Wine on ice and enjoy many local dishes, followed by the opportunity to crush grapes with your bare feet! We then get to have a tasting of Madeira wines. We continue to Porto da Cruz, and stroll through the village sampling the local rums. We pass through the first capital of Madeira, Machico, where navigators who discovered the island landed in 1420 on our return to Funchal. We enjoy dinner this evening at our hotel. (B,L,D)

FUNCHAL TO PORTO

This morning we leave this lush island and fly to Porto. Porto is a fascinating and vibrant city that is rapidly becoming one of Western Europe's most respected tourist destinations. Porto is a historic and varied city, from the narrow streets that make up the ancient Ribeira district through to the grand plaza of the Trindade district. The region is famed for the production of Port, which is still stored and matured in the vast cellars that stretch along the banks of the Douro River.

We board our coach and meet our local guide who takes us on an in-depth tour of the city. We travel down Avenida dos Aliados, which translates to 'Avenue of the Allies', to see the ornate buildings in a range of architectural styles. From neoclassical to French Beaux-arts, this avenue was built to impress! As such it is home to some of the city's most prestigious hotels along with several banks. We stop for photos at São Bento Station known for its 20,000 tiles, painted by João Colaço, which depict scenes from the traditional life of the north. We then visit the Palace of the Stock Exchange and its famous Arab Lounge. Stroll around Ribeira, one of the most popular neighbourhoods in Porto. It is one of the most authentic and picturesque parts of the city in the heart of the old town.

Following a traditional lunch, we visit a wine cellar in Vila Nova de Gaia and have a tour of their cellars and sample their famous Port wines. We transfer to our hotel to check and have dinner. (B,L,D)

DOURO VALLEY

The Douro River and the Douro Valley are known primarily for Port, a sweet wine that has been produced here for two thousand years. The spectacular landscape is characterized by improbably steep terraces covered in vines and dotted with wine-producing farms called Quintas. Hills fall steeply to the water's edge and the region becomes more and more sparsely populated as it travels inland from the coast.


We travel by coach to the capital of the Douro region — Régua — and visit a local winery for a wine tasting followed by lunch. Then we cruise the Douro River in a traditional Rabelo, navigating the unique river, in the heart of the oldest demarcated wine region of the world. From Pinhão, pass under the Eiffel iron bridges to the Tua area. Along the way, see hills of terraced vineyards with no roads or traffic in sight. On return to Pinhão we take some time to admire the Train Station and its collection of azulejos tiles from 1937. The four walls of the station are decorated with 24 blue glazed mosaics made of more than 100 azulejos and depict typical scenes of the Douro Valley all related to port wine production. We return to Porto for dinner at our hotel. (B,L,D)

AVEIRO & COIMBRA

We drive to Aveiro and board a moliceiro, a traditional Portuguese vessel with a long, slim body allowing it to move easily along the narrow canals of the city. Enjoy a glass of local sparkling wine as we pass the Art Nouveau style buildings that line the banks of the canal, the Aveiro salt pan, the traditional fisherman's neighbourhood of Beira-Mar, the Jerónimo P. Campos ceramics factory, and the Fish Market.

Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant before continuing to Coimbra, once the medieval capital of the country, now regarded as the university city and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We visit the University of Coimbra before continuing to Tomar. Join us for dinner this evening at our hotel. (B,L,D)

TOMAR & ÓBIDOS

Explore the former seat of the Order of the Knights Templar, the Convent of Christ. Built over the span of five centuries the magnificent architecture combines Romanesque, Gothic, Manueline, Renaissance, Mannerist and Baroque elements. The Convent's centrepiece is a 12^{th-century} rotunda, Oratory of the Templars. Following lunch in a local restaurant, we continue to the walled city of Óbidos to explore the charming narrow streets, traditional painted houses, and the imposing medieval castle. This evening join us for dinner at our hotel in Lisbon. (B,L,D)

Hotel M'ar de Ar Aqueduto, Evora (1 night)

EVORA, CORK & THE ALGARVE

Today we travel south to Evora, with its roots dating back to Roman times. Notice the impressive architecture of the white house, the tiles and the balconies. We visit the largest medieval cathedral in Portugal and the Chapel of Bones. We continue to Azaruja, to learn about one of Portugal's biggest industries, cork. This region produces more than 50% of the world's cork and you will see how cork is extracted and produced.

Following lunch in a local restaurant, we drive to Faro, the capital of the Algarve, known for its picturesque fishing villages built on cliffs overlooking beautiful beaches. With its Mediterranean climate, it is an ideal place to spend winters. Dinner this evening is at our hotel. (B,L,D)

LAGOS & SAGRES

Visit Lagos, a historic and wonderful city that boasts a rich seafaring heritage and a coastline of dramatic scenery. We travel to the extreme western tip of the Algarve to the city of Sagres with its immense cliffs and pristine beaches and visit the site of the School of Navigation. Following lunch at a local restaurant, we cruise along the coast of Lagos and Ponta da Piedade to see the rock formations and hidden grottos. (B,L,D)

TAVIRA

This morning we visit the authentic Algarvian city of Tavira. Discover the old town with its beautiful church of Misericórdia, whose interior is covered with magnificent panels of 18th-century historiated azulejos and the vestiges of the castle Moorish, with only crenellated walls enclosing a beautiful garden planted with roses, bougainvillea, hibiscus, and oleanders. It is here we will enjoy splendid views over the roofs of Tavira. Next we pass by the Roman Bridge which will allow us to discover a pleasant neighbourhood, near the quay with its lively perpendicular alleys. Enjoy lunch in a local restaurant before returning to the hotel where the remainder of the day will be at your leisure. (B,L,D)





LISBON

Enjoy a leisurely morning before we travel to Lisbon by coach. We stop along the way for lunch before arriving at our hotel this afternoon. Following check-in, spend the rest of the afternoon at your leisure before joining us for dinner. (B,L,D)

EXPLORING LISBON

Lisbon is the stunning capital city of Portugal and is one of the most charismatic and vibrant cities of Europe. It is a city that effortlessly blends traditional heritage, with striking modernism and progressive thinking. All of Lisbon awaits as we discover Rossio Square, Liberty Avenue, the Belém area with the St. Jerome Monastery, the Belém Tower and the Monument to the Discoveries. We visit the coach museum that houses the most unique collection in the world consisting of vehicles from the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries. This afternoon is at your leisure before we enjoy a traditional dinner and a soulful Fado show. (B,L,D)






QUELUZ, CASCAIS & SINTRA

Visit a beautiful Palace from the 18th century in Queluz, complete with formal gardens adorned with pools and statues, overlooked by the roughcast, and pastel-coloured Rococo façades. On our way to Cascais, we stop for a panoramic view of the Coast of Estoril before enjoying famous Portuguese Piri-Piri chicken for lunch.

We continue to Sintra, a mountain in the surroundings of Lisbon where Portuguese nobility and the royal family vacation in charming "quintas" or elegant palaces. Sintra is known for its colourful castle that is perched dramatically on a hill, surrounded by low-lying trees. We return to Lisbon, but not before stopping at Cabo da Roca, the most westernly point of Europe, for views of the Atlantic. (B,L,D)






Day 5-7






Day 8-9

HOTEL PORTOBAY AVENIDA, LISBON

Designed by the architect Frederico Valsassina, PortoBay Liberdade preserved the original early 20th-century façade creating an environment that evokes details from the past and the contemporary.
