Day 1 **Depart for Lisbon, Portugal**

Enjoy your private car home pick up service. Guests departing from the Toronto airport are assisted with their check-in. Meet your Journey Manager and fellow guests, and board your flight to Lisbon, Portugal. Day 2 **Lisbon**

On arrival in Lisbon, our local guide greets us with a smile. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant and settle in to your hotel with the afternoon at leisure. Our local guide and your Journey Manager are on hand to assist those who want to discover the local area. This evening, join us for a relaxing welcome dinner and meet your fellow travellers.

Day 3 **Lisbon**

This morning, all of Lisbon awaits as we discover the Belém area with the St. Jerome Monastery, the Belém Tower and the Monument to the Discoveries. Next, board a tuk tuk that will take you to the oldest and most characterful district of Lisbon, Alfama where you will find many of Lisbon's most iconic historic buildings, including the Se Cathedral, the Castelo de São Jorge and the National Pantheon. Your tuk tuk returns to the hotel where lunch and the remainder of the afternoon are free for you to explore on your own. A visit to the Coach Museum or the National Tile museum are a few of the possibilities.

This evening our guide treats us to a traditional dinner and Fado Show.

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Day 4 Sintra & Pena Palace

Today we discover Sintra, long the home of Portugal's monarchs, with mountaintop medieval fortifications, vibrant fairy tale castles, lush forests, and eccentric labyrinthine gardens, all in one location! It was for six centuries the favorite residence of the rulers and remains the resort of large Lisbon families who have charming "quintas" or elegant palaces. We visit the Pena Palace, an outstanding example of the 19th century Romanticism style architecture. For lunch we have a specialty of the area, roasted sirloin pig and local champagne. Before returning to Lisbon, we stop in Cabo da Roca, the western most point to of the European continent and pass through the coastal town of Cascais.

Day 5 Óbidos & Nazaré

A scenic, relaxing drive brings us to Óbidos, known as 'the Flowered Town of Portugal.' This well-preserved medieval town is without doubt one of Portugal's most classic walled settlements. Walk the ramparts, to enjoy views of windmills, vineyards and surrounding farmlands. Resembling an open-air museum, this walled medieval town has been preserved to look like a picture-postcard, with its monuments, narrow winding streets and white-washed houses with windows and terraces full of flowers. We continue to the famous fishing village of Nazaré for lunch in a seaside restaurant. Next, we travel to Coimbra and visit Conímbriga, one of the largest Roman settlements and classified as a National Monument in 1910. Following our visit we check into our hotel and settle in before dinner.

Day 6 Coimbra & Aveiro

Coimbra, set along the banks of the Mondego River, is Europe's oldest university town. A visit to the University's 18th-century library, considered one of the first copyright libraries in the world, is a must. We continue to Aveiro, described as the Venice of Portugal, which lies on the edge of the Ria de Aveiro, a saltwater lagoon that was historically farmed for its seaweed, salt and bountiful fish. We stop at the train station to admire the amazing panel of glazed tiles that decorated the façade and illustrates Aveiro's monuments and the entire region before taking part in a short workshop of 'Ovos Moles', a kind of wafer filled with egg's jam, a specialty of the city. Next, we board a Moliceiro, a brightly painted boat for canal tour. We continue to Porto and check into our hotel where we will have dinner.

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Day 7 Porto

Porto, the second largest cities in Portugal and one of the most picturesque. Built along the hillsides overlooking the mouth of the Douro River, it is an outstanding urban landscape boasting 2,000 years of history, displayed in the many and varied monuments, from the Cathedral with its Romanesque choir to the neoclassical Stock Exchange and the typically Portuguese Manueline-style Church of Santa Clara.

Today we discover Porto on foot and visit the Bolhão Market where locals go to purchase their fruits and vegetables, next we see the São Bento railway station to admire the azulejos which depict historical life scenes. We continue to the Lello bookstore, renowned as one of the most beautiful bookstores in the world and said to be an inspiration for Harry Potter books. We walk down Flower Street towards the river for some very photo worthy scenery. Lunch and afternoon are at your leisure to continue exploring this magnificent city. This evening dinner and tasting will be at a local Port cellar.

Day 8 Braga and the Sacred Way

Our journey take us to Braga to experience the Bom Jesus Sanctuary. The Sacred Way, a baroque granite double staircase with several switchbacks, might look daunting, but pilgrims manage to climb it on their knees. On the numerous landings are gardens, grottoes, small chapels, sculptures, and allegorical stone figures of the virtues set in fountains. The sanctuary at the top is 400 meters above sea level and provides us with a sweeping view of Braga, the beaches of Esposende and Viana do Castelo. Enjoy lunch overlooking the city. We continue to Guimarães, Portugal's first capital and birthplace of the nation's first king. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Guimarães boasts medieval streets and well preserved monuments which make it one of the most attractive places to visit in Europe. The town's imposing 10th-century medieval castle with its crenulated towers protected the population from attacks by the Moors and the Normans. This afternoon, we return to Porto and board the intimate Spirit of Chartwell.

Day 9 Amarante

The pretty, riverside town of Amarante is one of the gems of Northern Portugal. Its streets are lined with rows of 17th-century mansions boasting brightly painted wooden balconies. Our guide takes us on a walking tour to the famous Roman Bride and for a visit of the S. Gonçalo church and monastery. Enjoy free time to explore this lovely village or try some of the famous sweets and pastries or wander through the interesting Museu Amadeo Souza Cardoso.

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Return to the ship for lunch and a scenic cruise along the Douro River. After dinner, indulge in a Vintage Port Wine Celebration.

Day 10 Lamego & Our Lady of Remedies

Lamego, an old and historical town, is picturesque, warm and very charming. It houses one of the most important places of pilgrimage in the country, the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Remedies. This remarkable place has witnessed pilgrimages since the 14th century and showcases a small chapel dedicated to Saint Estevão. In the 16th century a new church was built over the old chapel, as it was almost in ruins. Today's chapel took 200 years to build and is a very good example of the Portuguese baroque style.

At the top of the hill, an impressive staircase of 686 steps is decorated with enormous panels of blue and white tiles. Enjoy free time to wander the narrow winding streets. Lamego also lays claim to some impressive cuisine, such as the 'bola e Lamego,' a bread filled with smoked ham, roasted kid, regional cakes and a tasty sparkling wine called 'Raposeira.' Returning to the Spirit of Chartwell, enjoy a culinary demonstration on board. Tonight we enjoy dinner at a local wine Quinta.

Day 11 Figueira de Castelo Rodrigo

This morning, we cruise a scenic section of the Douro on our way to Barca d'Alva. On board, relax with a lecture on the History of Portugal. After lunch, we venture ashore for a tour of Figueira de Castelo Rodrigo, a small fortified village with 13th-century walls. This is one of the 12 historical Parishes of Portugal and offers narrow medieval streets with 16th-century façades and Manuelino style windows. The Romans were the first to build a fortress here, and in 1209, Alfonso IX built the walls surrounding it. Jews, Arabs and Christians have peacefully co-existed here throughout the centuries and comprise the town's social fabric. Figueira de Castelo Rodrigo is known as the white village because of the almond trees found around it.

Monks began producing wine here in the 12th century, and today it has become a successful wine cooperative with a gold medal wine in 1991, the white Quinta do Cardo. Storks have flocked to this city for centuries and have become the town's symbol. This evening, we enjoy the Captain's Dinner and a Portuguese Folk music show.

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Day 12 Salamanca, Spain

Our journey takes us to explore Salamanca, situated in the centre of the 'Castillo e León' region, it has been a seat of learning since the early 13th century. Founded by Celtic Iberian tribes on the banks of the river Tormes, it has been occupied by the Romans, Arabs and Christians. In the 13th century, the oldest university of the Iberian Peninsula was created, and over the centuries, the city was enriched by visiting kings, princes, bishops and artists. As a result, many call this beautiful and historic city a living museum of the Middle Ages. Visit the University, House of Shells and the beautiful 'Plaza Mayor,' formally a site of bullfighting and now a popular gathering point for locals and visitors alike. A capital of culture since 2002, and a UNESCO World Heritage site since 1988, Salamanca showcases one of the finest mixtures of Renaissance and Plataresque architecture in Spain. Our lunch is in a lovely restaurant, so you can experience local fare and a traditional, lively Flamenco Show. Tonight, enjoy a traditional Portuguese barbecue on board.

Day 13 The Palace & Gardens of Mateus, Portugal

This afternoon, we travel to the land held by the last Count of Vila Real. In the Gardens of Mateus Palace, we discover the connection between Mateus Rose Wine and this beautiful 18th century house. Still owned by the Count of Vila Real, the palace has served as a Cultural Foundation, 'Casa de Mateus,' (The House of Mateus) since the 1970s. Its main aim is the preservation of the villa, study of its archives and the promotion of cultural, scientific and educational activities. Wander at leisure in the gardens, believed by many to be Portugal's most beautiful.

Overnight: Régua, Spirit of Chartwell

Day 14 Local Quinta

Today we explore the wonderful grounds and enjoy a sumptuous lunch at a local Quinta. Casa de Quintã is a manor house dating from 1740, with a spectacular size and indescribable beauty. Transformed into rural tourism, it is located in the heart of one of the most verdant and wonderful regions of the country. Following, lunch you will have some time to explore the grounds and beautiful gardens. This evening, you're your fellow travellers for a farewell cocktail and dinner.
