







DEPART FOR PARIS, FRANCE



EXPLORING PARIS

In store today is a full-day of exploring Paris, starting with a guided bus tour that unveils the city's most renowned landmarks such as the Opera House, Place Vendome, Champs Elysees, Conciergerie, Eiffel Tower, and Concorde Square.

Following your morning adventure, immerse yourself in the world of art with a private VIP tour of the Louvre. Admire timeless masterpieces including The Mona Lisa, the Winged Victory of Samothrace, and the Venus de Milo, gaining insights from expert guides along the way. Conclude your Louvre excursion with a tranquil walk through the Tuileries Gardens, offering a serene escape amidst the bustling city.





MONET'S GARDEN & INSPIRATION, GIVERNY

This morning, we bid au revoir to Paris and journey into Normandy. Our first stop is Giverny, where Claude Monet lived and worked from 1883 until his passing in 1926. His former home and the enchanting gardens that inspired his famed Water Lilies series are now the Fondation Claude Monet museum. Painstakingly restored in the 1970s, the house and gardens provide a stunning glimpse into the private sanctuary of the artist and gardener. The charming pink house and lush flower gardens offer a serene atmosphere, immersing visitors in the world of Monet.

JUNO BEACH, ARROMANCHES & THE LEGACY OF CANADA'S HEROES

On June 6, 1944, over 14,000 Canadian soldiers landed or parachuted into Normandy as part of the largest seaborne invasion in history. Despite the odds, these courageous soldiers played a pivotal role in securing Normandy.

We begin our day at the D-Day Museum in Arromanches, where the Allies built the artificial 'Mulberry' harbour to support the invasion. From the museum, enjoy views of the beach and remains of this engineering feat.

In the afternoon, walk on Juno Beach, reflecting on the same sand Canadian troops traversed in 1944. Our day concludes at the Canadian Cemetery in Beny-sur-Mer, a serene resting place for 2,049 soldiers and 15 airmen, where we pay respects to those who sacrificed their lives.





DEAUVILLE, HONFLEUR & NOYON: A DAY OF SEASIDE CHARM AND HISTORY

Explore Deauville, a glamorous resort town renowned for its beach, 1920s boardwalk, and chic boutiques. After an orientation tour, enjoy free time to wander and have lunch at your leisure.

Next, we visit Honfleur, a picturesque harbour town rich in maritime history, from which Samuel de Champlain set sail for Canada. Enjoy time to stroll, visit galleries, or relax by the harbour.

Later, we board the MS Deborah for a welcome cocktail, followed by an evening excursion to Noyon, where we uncover its 2,000-year history and marvel at the stunning Gothic cathedral illuminated at night.

ARMISTICE MEMORIAL & CHÂTEAU DE COMPIÈGNE

In the morning, enjoy a scenic cruise to Compiègne. This afternoon, embark on a guided tour of the historic city, walking through its picturesque streets to see the 16th-century town hall with its intricate Gothic facade and medieval homes, including the 15th-century La Vieille Cassine.

After a tasting of regional delicacies, visit the Armistice Memorial, home to the historic train car from the 1918 Armistice and wartime artifacts, including the Marne Taxi and stereoscopic images from World War I. The memorial honors soldiers from 1870 to the present, including Augustin Trébuchon, the last French soldier killed in World War I.

Conclude the day with a visit to the Château de Compiègne, one of France's largest and most stunning neoclassical palaces, rivaling Versailles and Fontainebleau.





CHÂTEAU DE CHANTILLY & CULINARY DELIGHTS


We'll spend the morning cruising to Pont-Sainte-Maxence. This afternoon, explore the magnificent Château de Chantilly, a masterpiece of French heritage. Once home to the Duke of Aumale, it houses an impressive collection of art and manuscripts, preserved since the 19th century. Visit the galleries, opulent suites, and one of France's most extensive libraries, all frozen in time since the Duke's bequest to the Institut de France.

Later, return to Saint-Leu-d'Esserent, where a special culinary experience awaits. A member of the Confrérie des Chevaliers Fouetteurs will teach us the secrets of making traditional crème chantilly by hand. After dinner, enjoy free time to explore the town or visit the abbatial church for scenic views of the valley.

VAN GOGH'S AUVERS-SUR-OISE & THE ABSINTHE EXPERIENCE

We begin the day with a scenic cruise to Auvers-sur-Oise, a picturesque village renowned for its artistic heritage. In the afternoon, we'll embark on a guided tour of Auvers-sur-Oise, once home to Vincent van Gogh during the final years of his life. Stroll through the village's charming streets, including the Artists' Pathway, where you'll be able to compare the landscapes captured by famous Impressionists with the present-day surroundings.

Next, we visit the Musée de l'Absinthe, a fascinating museum that immerses us in the bohemian spirit of the Belle Époque. This museum recreates the atmosphere of the cafés where absinthe, also known as the "green fairy," was the muse for poets and artists. The collection provides a fascinating glimpse into 19th-century French culture. Enjoy a demonstration of the traditional absinthe ritual and indulge in a tasting of this legendary drink.





VINEYARDS AND ARTISTIC TREASURES OF AUVERS-SUR-OISE

This morning, we visit the Pressoir Auversois vineyards, a hidden gem rediscovered in the 2000s. Located on the edge of the picturesque Auvers-sur-Oise countryside, the vineyards offer a unique glimpse into the region's winemaking heritage. After exploring the vineyards and wine press, we continue to the Maison-Atelier de Daubigny, a French historical monument and the former studio of landscape painter Charles-François Daubigny. The studio became a gathering place for renowned artists such as Camille Corot and Berthe Morisot, and its walls are adorned with masterpieces.

Later, we visit Madame Guinguette, where we'll indulge in a tasting of local delicacies amidst a beautiful setting.

In the afternoon, we set sail for Bougival, where we'll remain in port overnight.

CHÂTEAU DE MALMAISON & THE LIGHTS OF PARIS

This morning, set out on a guided tour of the Château de Malmaison, a place of elegance and influence deeply tied to Joséphine de Beauharnais. Acquired in 1799, this exquisite château became both her cherished home and a seat of power during Napoleon's rule. Step inside to explore its beautifully preserved interiors, where the council chamber—designed to resemble a military tent—once hosted key political discussions. The opulent music room, adorned with Joséphine's treasured paintings and harp, reflects her love for the arts, while the grand salons evoke the grandeur of early 19th-century society. After her divorce, Joséphine continued to reside here until her passing in 1814, leaving behind a legacy of refined taste and botanical passion. The château, now a Napoleonic museum, offers a captivating glimpse into her world, with original furnishings, artwork, and personal mementos.

Return on board for lunch as we begin our leisurely afternoon cruise toward Paris. This evening, we celebrate with a festive gala dinner, followed by a breathtaking nighttime cruise, down the Seine and through the City of Light—an unforgettable finale to the day.










Upper Deck
